St Catherine's is situated at the most southerly point of the Isle of Wight, off the A3055 near Niton.

Position 50° 34'.50 N 01° 17'.80 W (WGS 84 datum)

## Safety Notice:

*Restrictions to ascending the lighthouse tower staircases.*

A minimum height of 1 metre is required. Under no circumstances can children or babies be carried up the stairs. Sensible footwear must be worn.
